

NOTICE
Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, Part IV*:

Summerfeldt-Toole House
4075 Elgin Mills Road East
Markham, ON

The Summerfeldt-Toole House has design and physical value as a representative example of a mid-nineteenth century fieldstone farmhouse in the Classic Revival style as seen in its symmetrical composition, flat-headed doorcase with transom light and sidelights, and deep eave returns. The Summerfeldt-Toole House has historical value as it is associated with the Berczy Settler families who arrived in Markham in the late eighteenth century and played a significant role in the development of the early European-based community. The property also has historical value as it representative of the nineteenth century trend whereby farmsteads as the agricultural community progressed past the early settlement phase. Further, the property has contextual value because it is physically, functionally, visually and historically linked to its surroundings where it has stood since the mid-1850s.
